Brig. Gen. Jamison Herrera Named **DVS Acting Cabinet Secretary**

New Mexico Army National Guard Brigadier General Jamison Herrera has been appointed by Governor Michelle Lujan Grisham as acting cabinet secretary of the New Mexico Department of Veterans' Services (DVS).

He assumed the role on September 1 and will remain serving until a permanent cabinet secretary is named. Brig. Gen. Herrera, who is also the NMNG's deputy adjutant general, will continue serving in that capacity as the Guard's second-in-command.

Brig. Gen. Herrera has served 34 years in the New Mexico Army National Guard. He enlisted as a private 1st class in 1989 as a member of the 515th Maintenance Battalion in Santa Fe before enrolling and then being commissioned as an officer through the Officer Candidate School in 1991.

The Nambe, NM native worked his way up the ranks and then served in numerous leadership positions. Brig. Gen. Herrera earned a Bachelor of

Arts degree in University Studies, with and emphasis in education, from the University of New Mexico. He also earned a Master's Degree in Strategic Studies from the United States Army War College in Carlisle, PA.

VBOC Names New Director & Business Advisor



More than 5,000 Memorial Bricks Laid at 2023 Angel Fire Bricklaying

More than 500 memorial bricks were laid on September 2 during the annual Labor Day weekend bricklaying ceremony at the DVS-managed Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Angel Fire.

The bricks were placed along the pathways on the grounds of the popular monument. Each brick bore the name of a veteran--

alive or deceased. These bricks were purchased ahead of time by anyone wishing to honor a veteran in this unique way. Along with the name is that veteran's service branch, and his or her years of service.



Members of the Run For The Wall Foundation donated their time to lay the bricks. Three months ago, many of them stopped at the monument and spent the night in the area while riding in the annual Run For The Wall cross-country motorcycle ride to the national Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall in Washington, D.C. DVS is producing a video showing highlights of the bricklaying ceremony. The video should be completed soon and will be posted on the DVS Facebook page.

The conference provides training for the all-volunteer honor guards that render military honors at many veterans' funerals in New Mexico. The highlight of the day was a competition between these units that rendered military honors for a mock funeral—which was graded by a panel of judges.

DVS Gives Summer Native American Veterans Quarterly Briefing at Isleta Pueblo

DVS Pueblos and Tribal Liaison Beverly Charley held a summer quarterly briefing with Native American veteran representatives on September 1 at the Isleta Pueblo Veterans Association.

Charley explained that Acting Cabinet Secretary
Jamison Herrera, who was just named to the
position (see page 1 for more info), plans on meeting



with the Native American veteran community soon to hear their concerns and plans. Vietnam War veteran Chuck Zobac (standing in photo), who is media chair at the New Mexico Veterans Memorial, also gave a presentation on behalf of the Honor Flight of Northern New Mexico program—of which he is also a board member. He urged the Native American representatives to spread the word about this program that provides free all-inclusive round trips for older veterans to visit the national war monuments at the National Mall in Washington, D.C.

"We would really love to see Native American veterans on future flights. It's the one segment of the veteran population that hasn't been represented," he said. "Please spread the word. Let Korean and Vietnam War veterans know--these flights are free, and to experience the monuments in the company of their fellow veterans is something special."

Military & Veterans Day at the NM State Fair is September 12

Military veterans and National Guard/Reserve/ active-duty service members will be admitted free to the New Mexico State Fair for 2023 Military and Veterans Day at the State Fair on Tuesday, September 12.

This annual day at the state fair in Albuquerque is presented by DVS, the New Mexico National Guard, and the New Mexico State Fair to honor and thank the men

and women who have served our country as members of the United States military.

Veterans, National Guard/Reserve personnel, retirees, and active-duty service members must present either a valid Uniformed Services Retiree Identification Card, a veterans-designation driver's license, VA Veterans Health ID Card, or a copy of their DD-214 Separation Papers at the gate in order to obtain the free admission. Veterans and active-duty personnel must still pay for parking at any fairground parking lot. Non-veteran/non-military spouses or family members are not eligible for the free admission. In addition to the numerous rides and attractions at the state fair, there will be dozens of booths, exhibits and information tables throughout the fairgrounds.

2023 New Mexico Forgotten Heroes Funeral Set for September 28

The unclaimed cremated remains of 54 military veterans will be laid to rest during the 2023 Forgotten Heroes Funeral on September 28.

A brief memorial mass will be held at 9 a.m. at the Albuquerque Calvary Church chapel at 4001 Osuna Road NE. The 54 urns will then be loaded into hearses, which will receive a motorcycle escort by law enforcement and



members of the Patriot Guard Riders to the Santa Fe National Cemetery, at 501 North Guadalupe Street, for an 11 a.m. funeral service and interment.

The veterans are being provided this military funeral courtesy of New Mexico's Forgotten Heroes Burial Program, which was created by DVS and Bernalillo County to provide a military funeral for any honorably discharged veteran who, upon death, goes unclaimed by family or friends—ensuring that no veteran will ever be alone at the end.

The public is invited to attend and serve as "family" to provide a final salute for these 54 fallen veterans who have served our country.



News from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA)

PACT Act Deadline Extended for Many Post-9/11 Combat Zone Veterans

Veterans who deployed to a combat zone, never enrolled in VA health care, and left the military between Sept. 11, 2001, and Oct. 1, 2013, are eligible to enroll directly in VA health care through the PACT Act. This special enrollment period gives veterans who served in Iraq, Afghanistan and other combat zones an opportunity to enroll directly in VA health care without first applying for disability compensation benefits. But the deadline to take



'advantage of this expires at 9:59 p.m. Mountain Time on Sept. 30,

This special enrollment period is a part of the PACT Act, the largest expansion of VA health care and benefits in generations. Since President Biden signed the PACT Act into law Aug. 10, 2022, more than 344,000 veterans have enrolled in VA health care, and more than 4.2 million enrolled veterans have been screened for toxic exposures.

"Are you a veteran who deployed to a combat zone but never enrolled in VA health care? You should sign up now. Even if you don't need this care now, you may need it in the future, and once you're in, you have access for life. But don't wait – the deadline is Sept. 30 – so go to <u>VA.gov/PACT</u> and apply today," said VA Secretary Denis McDonough.

Although this deadline is written into law for this specific group of veterans, many other groups of veterans are able to enroll directly in VA health care without first applying for other VA benefits—including many Vietnam War veterans, Gulf War veterans, veterans who deployed to a combat zone and transitioned out of the service less than 10 years ago, and more. Veterans who do not meet any of the above criteria can often still access VA health care by filing for VA disability compensation benefits or based on income. If a veteran is granted service connection for any health condition, they become eligible for VA care. The PACT Act also expanded VA disability compensation benefits for millions of veterans, making more than 300 health conditions "presumptive" for service connection. This means that if an eligible veteran has one of these health conditions and served in the applicable place during an applicable time, VA automatically assumes that the condition was caused by the veteran's service and provides compensation and care accordingly.

DVS Field Offices in New Mexico

DVS has field offices throughout the state that are staffed with nationally accredited veterans service officers. DVS VSOs are dedicated to helping veterans with filing VA claims, applying for state veterans benefits, or with helping with anything else a veteran or their family needs with.

Office hours are Monday-Friday from 8am-5pm, (excluding holidays). Though this service is free, appointments are required and can be

made by contacting the VSOs below. Please note: VSOs can also provide help by phone or email to any veteran or eligible dependent—regardless of their location.
