
Military and Veterans Day At The Legislature “Celebrating Our History, Building Our Future”

New Mexico will proudly honor its military Veterans, National Guard members, reservists, and active-duty service members during the 2026 Military and Veterans Day at the Legislature on Tuesday, February 3, 2026, at the New Mexico State Capitol, 490 Old Santa Fe Trail, Santa Fe, New Mexico, 87501. Information tables will open at 8:00 a.m. in the East and West exhibition halls, followed by a formal ceremony at 12:00 p.m. in the Capitol Rotunda, bringing together service members, Veterans, families, and state leaders to recognize military service. Presented by the New Mexico Department of Veterans' Services (NMDVS) in partnership with the New Mexico National Guard (NMNG), this annual event reflects New Mexico's strong commitment to honoring those who have served and supporting the military and Veteran community across the state.

The day will offer opportunities to meet with legislators and engage in conversations about supporting Veterans, active-duty service members, and their families. Attendees can also connect with service organizations dedicated to improving the lives of past and present service members across the state.

“Celebrating Our History, Building Our Future” is this year’s theme and carries special significance. Following the 250th anniversaries of the U.S. Army, U.S. Navy, and U.S. Marine Corps in 2025, and as our nation and New Mexico now mark 250 years of history, we recognize the men and women whose courage, commitment, and sacrifice built and defended both New Mexico and the United States.

Veterans, service members, families, and the public are invited to attend. Military and Veterans Day at the Legislature honors service, connects attendees with resources, and reaffirms New Mexico’s commitment to those who have defended our freedoms while strengthening the future of our military and Veteran community.

Anniversary of the Start of the Gulf War



This month marks the anniversary of the start of the Gulf War, a major United States and coalition military effort that unfolded in response to Iraq's invasion and annexation of Kuwait in August 1990. The international community swiftly condemned the aggression, and after months of diplomatic pressure and the buildup of coalition forces under Operation Desert Shield, military action began on January 17, 1991.



Operation Desert Storm opened with an extensive air campaign designed to weaken Iraqi command, control, and infrastructure, followed by a coordinated ground offensive that advanced across Kuwait and southern Iraq. The conflict involved forces from more than thirty nations and represented one of the largest military coalitions assembled since World War II. Hundreds of thousands of American service members participated in the effort, serving in roles ranging from air and ground combat operations to logistics, medical support, engineering, and communications.



For New Mexico, the conflict was not a distant event overseas. The New Mexico Air National Guard 150th Fighter Group, based at Kirtland Air Force Base in Albuquerque, played a direct role. On December 11, 1990, members of the unit's Security Police Flight deployed to Saudi Arabia in support of the mission.



Also called up was the 720th Transportation Company of the New Mexico Army National Guard from Las Vegas, New Mexico; another example of local citizen soldiers responding to a global crisis.



Nationwide, the scale of the commitment was vast. By the end of the conflict, about 700,000 United States service members had deployed to the Gulf region. Approximately 17 percent of those came from National Guard and Reserve units, showing how many citizen soldiers from everyday jobs and small towns answered the call to serve.

In doing so, those New Mexicans served alongside active-duty forces in a mission that influenced global security. Their contributions helped bring about liberation and regional stability, and their service remains a meaningful thread in New Mexico's military heritage.

As we observe this anniversary, the New Mexico Department of Veterans' Services extends our gratitude to the Veterans who served in Operation Desert Shield and Operation Desert Storm, and we also recognize the families who supported them before, during, and after deployment. Their sacrifices and ongoing support remind us how world events can directly shape the lives of our local communities.

Upcoming NMDVS Veterans' Benefits Outreach Visits

NMDVS is scheduled to make the following outreach visits at the locations listed below.

Veterans and/or their eligible dependents are encouraged to stop by to file for or ask information about—VA disability ratings, VA medical or mental health care, retiree pensions, military burials, and other VA benefits.

Staff can also help with applying for state Veterans' benefits such as discounted fishing and hunting licenses, Veterans' license plates, property tax exemptions, state park passes, and many more state Veterans' benefits.

Please bring a copy of your DD-214, NA 13038, NOAA 56-16, PHS 1867, Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty, which are necessary for filing all Veterans' benefits claims. VA award letter showing percentage of disability, NM Driver's License, ID, voter Registration card, and Widow/Widower copy of marriage and death certificates if applicable. NMDVS can help Veterans file for lost or misplaced DD 214s.

What to Expect When You Meet with a Veteran Service Officer

Meeting with a Veteran Service Officer (VSO) for the first time can feel overwhelming, but it doesn't have to be. The initial meeting is simply a conversation where we learn about your service, your health, and the benefits you want to pursue. We review your DD-214 and any medical or service records you may have. If you do not have all of your documents, a VSO can help you request them from the appropriate sources.

Once your records are gathered, a VSO will begin preparing your claim forms. We explain why each document is important and submit a complete claim directly to Veterans Affairs (VA). After submission, a VSO continues to monitor your claim, communicate with the VA on your behalf, and update you on any requests for additional information.

Working with a VSO ensures you are not navigating the VA system alone. We provide ongoing support, answer questions, and help you understand each step of the process. Veterans who work with a VSO often feel more confident and better prepared to advocate for themselves. If you are planning to file a claim or have questions about your benefits, schedule an appointment with a local accredited VSO today and take the first step toward making your benefits work for you.

Tips for Your First VSO Visit

- Bring your DD-214 or other separation documents.
- Gather any medical and service records related to your claim.
- Write down your questions and goals before the meeting.
- Be honest and thorough about your service and health history.
- Take notes during the visit so you remember next steps.
- Ask your VSO to explain any forms or processes you don't understand.
- Don't worry if you're missing records, your VSO can help request them.

Mobile Outreach Vehicle Ribbon Cutting January 30th



The New Mexico Department of Veterans' Services will host a ribbon-cutting ceremony on **Friday, January 30, 2026, from 10:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. at the New Mexico Veterans Memorial Park, 1100 Louisiana Blvd. SE, Albuquerque**, to celebrate the launch of its new Veterans Mobile Unit.

The Mobile Unit expands access to Veteran benefits and services by bringing claims assistance, benefits counseling, and outreach directly to Veterans where they live and gather, particularly in rural New Mexico communities. The unit is fully self-sufficient and staffed by accredited Veteran Service Officers, enabling state and federal benefits claim services to be delivered efficiently across the state.

The public is invited to attend and help mark this important step forward in improving access and opportunity for New Mexico's Veterans and their families.

The New Mexico Department of Veterans' Services is here to help Veterans, and their families obtain state and federal benefits.

Property Tax Exemptions and Lifetime Veteran Park Passes

The New Mexico Department of Veterans' Services (NMDVS) State Benefits Division is accepting applications for the Veterans property tax exemptions and the NM State Park Lifetime Veterans Pass.

1. Property Tax Exemptions:

The standard Veteran property tax exemption is now \$10,000 and will adjust annually for inflation in 2026. Additionally, the Disabled Veteran Exemption allows eligible Veterans or their unmarried surviving spouses to apply for a tax exemption equal to the Veteran's federal disability rating.

Applications must be submitted to NMDVS and filed with your County Assessor.



2. New Mexico State Park Lifetime Veterans Pass:

Eligible New Mexico Veterans can apply for a free lifetime pass providing unlimited access to all state parks, including day-use and overnight camping. Standard entry and camping fees are waived; however, reservation and special facility fees still apply.

Documents needed to verify eligibility for the benefits

- A copy of DD-214, NA 13038, NOAA Form 56-16, or PHS Form 1867
- Proof of New Mexico residency (driver's license, voter registration, or state tax return)
- VA Award Letter showing percentage of disability (only for tax exemption)
- Widow/Widower copy of marriage and death certificates (only for tax exemption)

NMDVS schedules Veteran property tax exemption events that are held throughout the state to explain changes and issue certificates. Applications for the New Mexico State Park Lifetime Veterans Pass will also be accepted and issued on-site to qualified Veterans.

Information and assistance on federal and state benefits, local Veterans' programs, and referral services are available at any of our field office locations.

NM Dept of Veterans' Services & Rio Arriba County Assessor's office representatives will be on site to assist eligible veterans and unmarried widows applying for:

- * \$10,000 Standard Veterans Property Tax Exemption.
- * Percentage Based Disabled Veterans Property Tax Exemption.
- * Disabled Veterans Permanent & Total property Tax Waiver.

The following documents will be required to verify Property Tax certificate eligibility:

1. A copy of your DD-214, NA 13038, NOAA form 56-16, or PHS form 1867
 - * DD214 must be full form, unredacted and include character of service
 - * Visit www.archives.gov to request discharge paperwork if needed.
2. If applicable, VA Federal Award letter verifying service-connected disability rating
 - * If you do not have a copy of your current VA Award letter, a free copy can be obtained by establishing an account at www.va.gov or by calling 1-800-827-1000.
3. Proof of New Mexico Residency – Includes one of the following documents:

Valid NM Driver's license / Current voters registration card / Most recent NM income tax return

Holiday Visit to State Veterans' Home in T or C



On Friday, December 19th, the New Mexico State Veterans' Home (NMSVH) in Truth or Consequences welcomed leadership from the New Mexico Department of Veterans' Services (NMDVS) for a special holiday visit focused on connection and spreading seasonal cheer.

During the visit, residents were presented with creative comfort totes as a heartfelt token of appreciation for the service and sacrifice of the Veterans and family members who call the home their own. In the spirit of the season, additional holiday totes were also sent to residents at the Fort Bayard State Veterans' Home in Santa Clara, NM, ensuring Veterans at both facilities were remembered and honored.

The tour was graciously guided by NMSVH Assistant Administrator Otes Farr-Galloway and Eva Peña, who shared insight into the care, services, and daily operations that support Veterans at the facility. NMDVS Cabinet Secretary Jamison Herrera, Deputy Secretary Eric James, and Benefits Director Edward Mendez personally delivered the holiday totes and visited with residents throughout the home.

The professionalism and compassion demonstrated by the NMSVH care professionals and staff were evident throughout the visit. From the welcoming environment to the beautiful facility itself, the team's dedication to honoring and caring for Veterans was clearly on display. NMDVS extends its sincere appreciation to the staff, Veterans, and their families for the visit.

The New Mexico Department of Health oversees the New Mexico State Veterans' Home. Recent renovations were made possible through forty million dollars in legislative funding and an additional twenty million dollars in bond funds.

The new facilities opened in 2024 and were designed to enhance residents' comfort, dignity, and quality of life.

The modern campus features private suites with individual bedrooms and accessible bathrooms. The home includes 131 beds and serves honorably discharged Veterans, their spouses, and parents who have lost children in the service of their country.

Holiday Meal Kits for New Mexico Veterans and Seniors

With funding from the Governor's Hunger Fund, staff and volunteers from the New Mexico Department of Veterans' Services (NMDVS), Aging and Long-Term Services, and the Health Care Authority (HCA) joined forces on December 18th at the HCA warehouse in Albuquerque to assemble holiday meal kits. HCA staff transported the holiday meal kits throughout the state. This annual program is part of Governor Michelle Lujan Grisham's ongoing commitment to supporting vulnerable New Mexicans.



Each kit included spiral-cut ham, green beans, potatoes, butter, rolls, eggnog, pie, and a blanket provided by the NMDVS. These meal kits were distributed to Veterans and seniors in coordination with the New Mexico Indian Affairs Department in Laguna, Zuni, To'Hajiilee, and Acoma. Veteran organizations and senior centers are also supported distribution efforts in Roswell, Gallup, Grants, Deming, Lordsburg, Raton, Santa Rosa, and Tucumcari.

A Season of Remembrance

In December 2025, communities across New Mexico gathered at Veteran cemeteries throughout the state to honor the service and sacrifice of our nation's heroes through annual wreath-laying ceremonies. These visits were a meaningful reminder that those who served are never forgotten.

At New Mexico's state Veteran cemeteries in Angel Fire, Gallup, and Fort Stanton, volunteers, Veterans, families, and community organizations placed evergreen wreaths on the graves of fallen service members. Wreaths were also laid at Santa Fe National Cemetery, where volunteers joined families and Veterans in honoring thousands of service members who are laid to rest there. The ceremonies were part of the annual Wreaths Across America observance, which brings communities together nationwide each December to remember the fallen, honor those who served, and teach future generations the value of freedom.

These annual ceremonies passed on the values of service and sacrifice as New Mexicans gathered to honor the past and strengthen the bond between our communities and those who served.



Four Chaplains Day

February 3, 2026, marks the 83rd anniversary of Four Chaplains Day, a solemn occasion to honor four U.S. Army chaplains whose courage and compassion during World War II remain a powerful example of servant leadership, unity, and sacrifice.

On the night of February 3, 1943, the troop transport USAT Dorchester was traveling through the dangerous waters of the North Atlantic, often called “Torpedo Alley,” near Greenland. With more than 900 service members and crew aboard, the ship came under torpedo attack from a German U-boat. As the Dorchester lost power and began to sink into the freezing waters, chaos erupted below deck.



Amid the panic, four chaplains of different faiths moved calmly into action: George Fox, Alexander Goode, John Washington, and Clark Poling. Together, they guided soldiers to life-boats, distributed life jackets, and offered prayers and words of comfort in English, Hebrew, and Latin to steady frightened men facing the unthinkable.

When the ship's supply of life vests ran out, the four chaplains made their ultimate sacrifice. Each removed his own life jacket and gave it to a young soldier who had none. Survivors later recalled a lasting image: the four chaplains standing together on the slanted deck, arms linked in prayer and song, as the Dorchester slipped beneath the waves. Of the 902 men on board, only 230 survived.

As we observe Four Chaplains Day in 2026, the New Mexico Department of Veterans' Services proudly joins the nation in honoring these four men and the enduring values they represent. Their example reminds us that service transcends faith, background, and rank, and that true leadership is defined by compassion, courage, and a selfless commitment to others.

Did you know:

The first woman to enlist in the U.S. military in a non-nursing role was Loretta Perfectus Walsh, who joined the U.S. Naval Reserve in March, 1917 as a Chief Yeoman (F) for World War I. This broke barriers by serving in clerical/administrative work and becoming the first female Chief Petty Officer, opening doors for thousands of women in non-traditional roles. Her enlistment proved women could handle technical and administrative jobs, leading to over 11,000 other women joining as "yeomanettes" to support the war effort.

I've been with NMDVS for six years, and it's been a meaningful journey.


What do you enjoy most about your work with NMDVS?

News from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA)

Servicemembers' Group Life Insurance Benefit Option

VA has announced an amendment to the Servicemembers' Group Life Insurance (SGLI), Family SGLI (FSGLI), and Veterans' Group Life Insurance (VGLI) Accelerated Benefit Option (ABO) regulation.

This update allows an alternate applicant to apply for an ABO on a member's behalf, such as when a member is medically incapacitated. With accelerated benefits, you can get up to 50% of the face value of your coverage in increments of \$5,000—paid to you before death.

This change will:

- Allow an alternate applicant to apply for the ABO on behalf of a terminally ill member who is medically incapacitated.
- Authorize a member to apply for the ABO when their insured spouse is terminally ill.
- Ensure that stepchildren and children aged 18-22 who are in school are included in FSGLI dependent child coverage.

This change comes as an update to the ABO that's been in effect since 1998 when only the member could apply. Visit VA benefits for more information: <https://www.va.gov/life-insurance/totally-disabled-or-terminally-ill/>
